The Clay Studio is a non-profit, educational arts organization dedicated to the promotion and development of the ceramic arts and the work of new clay artists. The Clay Studio supports the ceramic arts through its artist residencies, gallery and shop, permanent collection, studio space, school, and outreach programs. The Clay Studio believes in promoting broad access to the ceramic arts; accordingly, it gears its programs to all levels of interest and proficiency. All proceeds will benefit The Clay Studio's artistic and educational mission.

Ruth Snyderman founded The Works Gallery in 1965. It is one of the oldest exhibiting galleries in the field of contemporary studio crafts, representing selected artists working in figurative, narrative and functional ceramics, glass, jewelry, fiber and wood. Ruth was an active founder of the South Street Renaissance, stimulating the growth of the arts and culture on South Street into a vibrant community of artists and activists in 1970's Philadelphia.

Ruth's husband Rick Snyderman joined her in the operation of the gallery in 1972. In 1983, the Snydermans co-founded a second operation, Snyderman Gallery, to create a specifically focused exhibition space for the rapidly developing areas of studio furniture and sculptural glass, while Works Gallery concentrated on artists in ceramics, jewelry and fiber. During the 1980's, both became leading national galleries in those fields, mounting landmark exhibitions such as glass and ceramics designed by Ettore Sottsass' Memphis Group, one of the first exhibits of architect Robert Venturi's post-modern chair and table designs for Knoll, and solo exhibits by the likes of Dale Chihuly, William Morris and many other pioneers in the field of glass sculpture.

In 1992, Snyderman Gallery acquired a 6,000 square foot space in Old City Philadelphia, playing an important role in the revitalization of that area into one of the major cultural districts of the city. The new space enabled Snyderman Gallery to expand into painting, prints, photography and sculpture. In 1996, the two galleries combined their operations in Old City.
